# BACKGROUND - © 5 min

**Bollywood** is a Hindi-language sector of the Indian movie making industry that began in Bombay (now Mumbai) in the 1930s and developed into an enormous film empire. Bollywood now makes more films than Hollywood each year.

## WATCH, LISTEN AND DISCUSS - (5) 15 min

### The Bombay Royale - I Love You Love You

The Bombay Royale are an Australian band that write and perform music in the Bollywood style.

Ask students to notice the following Bollywood references as they watch this video by The Bombay Royale:

- Dramatic costumes
- Bollywood-style dancing
- Use of English alongside Hindi words such as 'diwana' (crazy) and 'kaise sambhalna yeh' (how to look after you)
- The song is a love story like many Bollywood movies

What other aspects of the video or song do the students find interesting?

## EXTENSION - © 20 min

Explore some Indian instruments as a whole class with the computer program Sound Infusion.

- 3. Go to the studio section of the website
- 4. Select India in the library, and explore the instruments that are there
- 5. Create an arrangement of those sounds by dragging them around the studio
